40th Annual Bourne Scallop Festival (registration deadline is Sept. 4)

For almost 40 years, this simple shellfish has been the center of attention in Bourne - and why not? Sweet and succulent, baked, saute'd or deep-fried, this traditional Cape Cod delicacy has been attracting visitors throughout New England. But the Bourne Scallop Festival features so much more. Originally conceived as a way to raise money and showcase local shellfish, the Scallop Festival has grown into the Upper Cape's ultimate event, attracting nearly 50,000 people annually. The festival features an Arts & Crafts Show and Home Expo Show, featuring over 130 vendors, rides and games, fantastic free musical entertainment - and of course great food! Tickets for either a Scallop or Herb Roasted Chicken dinner are included for you to enjoy any time during your visit (1:30-4:30 p.m.) to the Festival. Prior to attending the Festival, we will enjoy a relaxing morning cruise (11:30-1 p.m.) from Onset, MA through the tranquil harbor into the Cape Cod Canal - the man made waterway connecting Cape Cod Bay with Buzzards Bay. During the 90-minute cruise you'll pass the Gray Gables- Grover Cleveland's home and Massachusetts Maritime Academy Training Ship as well as Buzzard's Bay Park the site of the Scallop Festival.

We'll leave very early Saturday morning so we can get there at a leisurely pace. If you need equipment, we have a number of backpacks, sleeping bags, tents, stoves, etc. for everyone to borrow.

Hike Leader: Dr. David Kloss, a lover of the out-of-doors. Father of 4; active Boy Scout leader. He has been backpacking since he was 12 years old. Loves to teach and has been taking his own kids backpacking since they were 7 years old.

Location: Hike part of the Appalachian Trail in Massachusetts (about 2.5 hr. drive)

Days: Required planning, informational meeting Sept. 12, 10 a.m.-noon (MCC during KYTF)

Overnight Trip, Sept. 26 and 27 (trip is rain or shine)
 Time: (280001-A) Van leaves the CC at 6 a.m. on Sat. and returns approximately 6 p.m. on Sun.

Fee: \$15 per family group (father and daughter(s)) for residents/\$25 for non-residents
 In addition there will be an approximate \$30 per person fee for food, fuel, etc. This fee will be less if you bring your own food and stove (to be determined at the mandatory pre-hike meeting.)

Mayflower and Plimoth Plantation (registration Deadline is Oct. 30)

Mayflower II has many stories to tell and many people to tell them. You will meet staff in modern-day clothing who speak from a present-day perspective. They can talk with you about the original Mayflower as well as the reproduction vessel Mayflower II. Along side are reproductions of a 17th-century shallop and a ship's boat. You may recognize this ship's boat from the Emmy-nominated PBS series Colonial House or the recent feature film, The New World.

Plimoth Plantation find yourself immersed in the year 1627, just seven years after the voyage of the Mayflower. Your visit to the year 1627 is self-guided, so feel free to wander around the village at your own pace. Do not be afraid to walk in on colonists as they eat, question them as they work, or join a lively conversation in the street. Most of the objects in and around their houses are modern reproductions designed for everyday use and can be handled gently. You needn't be an expert in the language of Shakespeare to pose a question, either. Just ask and see what happens - you may be called upon to define "bathroom" or even explain what a "Pilgrim" is! Take this unique opportunity to explore the 17th-century perspective of the English who traveled across the Atlantic. You may be surprised at what you learn!
